The South Grey Bruce Youth Literacy Council started in 1989, and our core program is free, confidential, one-on-one tutoring for children and youth, 6-18, who are trying to build reading, spelling or math skills. We have helped hundreds of young learners get up to grade level, improve their confidence, and stay in school..

We have a resource centre free for use by all in our community, and we offer workshops and presentations to parents and caregivers on ways to support the child or youth in their life. We speak to service clubs and other organizations who have an interest in literacy and youth.

Thanks to the Ontario Trillium Foundation, we launched Literacy on its Feet—Drama Stream in 2015, workshops that build improv and scripting skills, along with team, listening, conflict resolution and literacy skills. The program continues with up to three 6-week sessions per year.

All our services to learners are without charge, and we are always accepting new learners.

We organize competitions and productions to celebrate the benefits of literacy. In the past, we have partnered with WordsAloud Festival. This year, Hanover Rotary has sponsored an essay competition for students Grades 7-12, in which they interview an older resident and create an essay on “My Childhood Home”. Contest deadline is March 9, 2018.

We are always looking for tutors, senior high school students and adults who love reading, are patient and flexible. We screen and train all potential tutors and workshop facilitators.

We accept referrals without cost from any family, caregiver or older student who identifies a need for this kind of help. We are always developing learning alternatives to boost these all-important literacy skills.
